1) **ACTION ITEMS**

- MD to complete form 301 for the new priorities.
- RG to look into 'Sure Start' programme.
- MD to continue efforts to improve community representation on the panel.

Meeting start 19.10 hrs.

2) MINUTES OF LAST MEETING

Minutes read over and agreed. Matters arising were discussed as below.

3) MATTERS ARISING

The following action items arising from the meeting on 13th October were discussed.

1. DW to set up new area contacts for ward panel
MD explained that an open invite was sent out via the monthly SN newsletter. All Neighbourhood Watch coordinators and resident association chairs had been invited to attend. MW thanked for efforts in providing further suitable contacts.
2. DW to consult with youth services and ensure their attendance at next meeting.
MD explained that youth services had been contacted but had failed to attend.
3. QP to investigate the success of Muswell Hill youth club and invite a senior staff member to the ward panel meeting to answer questions and report to the panel on good practice.
QP gave a report on Muswell Hill youth club and urged panel members to attend and observe for themselves the workings etc. MD added that the club was being used quite extensively by youths from the ward with some success.
4. QP to check availability for course on 6th December
QP gave quick account of course that he had attended.
5. MG to check on Campsbourne Community Centre
MG not present.
6. MG to ensure the attendance of at least one representative from Housing/ASBAT at next meeting.
MG not present - apology for absence noted.

4) Policing Activity report

- MD gave a summary of the policing activities undertaken by the team in the proceeding 6 months in relation to the main priorities of Youth Anti-Social Behaviour by youths/gangs on the Campsbourne Estate and Drug/alcohol misuse and supply.

The team researched and applied for the dispersal zone for the Campsbourne Estate (due to end 21st January 2009) and has maintained a highly visible presence in the area. Powers of stop and search have been used where appropriate. The team was also successful in seizing several mopeds being ridden anti-socially. Hornsey SNT has secured two crack house closure orders and shut down the operation of a cannabis factory following the execution of drug warrants. In addition to the above enforcement tactics the team has worked closely with partners on several suitable youth engagement /diversion schemes due to be implemented in the next couple of months. These include 'Pedsafe' a scheme to provide training in moped use and the LIFE project run by London Fire Brigade.

- There was then a very lengthy discussion regarding youth provision on the ward.

MO stated that the YMCA had numerous premises/studios that would be suitable and available for such use. He explained that funding would be required for the provision of youth workers etc. He also stated that the YMCA run a fitness instructors course for person 15 – 30 years of age that may be able to accommodate youth referrals from the ward.

JEB raised the suggestion of community awards to encourage and promote positive work and action by local youths.

5) Selection of new priorities

MD gave a report on the consultation process that took place in November 2008. Public perception surveys were completed during face-to-face interviews of 200 people, chosen at random, who either live, work or regularly visit Hornsey Ward. There were “have a Say” days amongst parents outside schools and shoppers in the high Street. The results were then analysed and the following priorities were identified.

- a) Youth ASB - verbal noise/nuisance on the Campsbourne Estate
- b) Burglary – across the ward area.
- c) Drug/alcohol misuse and supply.

There was then a discussion as to how best to tackle these issues and whether these should be the policing priorities for the next six months. After which the above priorities were ratified.

Youth ASB discussion points raised

- 1) To maybe get Adam Jogee to get involved (BD)
- 2) Engagement at street level ideally door to door (PGH)
- 3) To look at YMCA involvement/facilities (MO)
- 4) To look at TA involvement (EP) although they have been reluctant to come out into the community but are happy for people to come to them
- 5) How to stop youths congregating in flats intimidating residents. (JB)
- 6) Look at information that can be printed on leaflets

Burglary discussion points raised

- 1) How to get people to review their home security
- 2) Homes for Haringey fixing locks quickly etc.

Personal safety

- 1) Report that middle lane by the park "felt" unsafe (CL, PGH & JEB)

7) DATE OF NEXT MEETING

The next meeting will be the Annual General Meeting. At this meeting the business shall include the election of the Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson and Secretary and the transaction of other constitutional matters as may be necessary.
