Dear Resident

This is the May 2008 newsletter from the St Ann's Safer Neighbourhood Team. The purpose is to keep you informed of the team's activities on a monthly basis. Also to let you know of any crime patterns and trends and some crime prevention advice.

Community Events

The team attended the opening of the revamped Chestnut Park. We set up a stall in the park on a glorious sunny day and it was lovely to see the park so busy. PCSO Yaman wore the outfit of PSCO Steve (pictured) and entertained the children. From the stall we were able to promote Safer Neighbourhoods and offer some crime prevention advice.



Later in May we were invited to the Chestnut Community Centre for the HARTS (Haringey Tenancy Support) event. Again this was well attended with a variety of stalls and events taking place performances including African Drumming, Albanian Folk Dance, Rhubarb the Clown and a Bouncy Castle.

PCSO's Kalkan and Yaman attended St Ann's Church to present certificates to pupils from St Ann's School who had taken part in the Road Safety Initiative outside their school in May.

Search Warrants

The team has been involved in the execution of three search warrants this month and this has led to three arrests for varying offences. One of these was for possession with intent to supply drugs. We have worked closely with the Haringey Drugs Focus Unit and if premises are identified as concerned in the dealing of drugs then action will be taken. If these premises are also linked to anti-social behaviour then closure orders can be sought.

Wickes

We have been speaking to local residents and commuters. This has been through the completion of Questionnaires and Street Briefings. We have also spoken to the males who gather in the area with the assistance of Police Officers and PCSO's from other Boroughs with the necessary language skills. I will take the findings back to the next partnership meeting on the 13th June.

Burglary

The month of May has seen an increase on last year. The team continues to push the crime prevention message. With the summer now with us open windows or windows, which haven't been locked, create opportunities. Please secure all windows when you leave and likewise if you're sat in the rear garden don't leave window open on the ground floor at the front. Make sure items such, as laptops aren't visible through the front windows. They are a particular favourite at the moment. You may get a knock on the door from us if your premises appear vulnerable from the street or a card through your letterbox informing you that you have left windows open. We have also put up street signs to reinforce this message.

Youth Anti- Social Behaviour

We have been patrolling our priority area identified and took part in an estate walkabout with LBH around Victoria Crescent and Helston Court and spoke to a number of residents. The team has spoken to a number of individuals and we will continue to patrol and take action as necessary. There has been a problem with some of the lighting in the alleyway off Russell Road. The alleyway that runs through to Elizabeth Road is particularly dark. I have been told that this will be rectified shortly.

Street Drinking

The seating in Culvert Road has previously attracted some street drinking. After looking at the maps of the new controlled drinking areas it's apparent that this seating does fall into the controlled area. I will see to it that signs are put up and monitor the area. The team have seized alcohol from a number of persons in our area of Seven Sisters Road.

Drug and Alcohol Misuse Grand Parade

We have executed a drugs search warrant on a residential address in the area. We will be taking part in joint working with the Harringay Safer Neighbourhood Team and are looking to build on relationships with local businesses. Information is the key to tackling drug dealing and information can be given confidentially to ourselves or through crimestoppers.

Neighbourhood Watch

A new neighbourhood watch has started in Terront Road N15. The inaugural meeting took place in the Salvation Army Hall in May. It was an excellent turnout and our thanks go to the coordinator for promoting the scheme.
